NAMI 5K Walk

The National Alliance on Mental Illness is the nation's largest grassroots mental health organization dedicated to building better lives for the millions of Americans affected by mental illness. NAMI walks are 5K events occurring across the country that raise awareness and support for NAMI organizations. Last spring, our chapter raised over \$5,600 dollars and participated in a virtual walk to support NAMI. Last fall, we did a similar 5k event to raise money for Children's National Hospital and actually hosted the virtual 5k for our area though our chapter.

Habitat for Humanity

This is our largest outreach event every year. Habitat for Humanity is an annual weeklong service trip where members travel to Flagler Beach, Florida to work with low-income families to help construct houses. Under the supervision of experienced construction workers, members are able to help combat housing instability and unaffordable housing while gaining valuable teamwork and craftsmanship skills. Our members loved the opportunity to serve the community and had a great time building both houses and relationships this past spring!



INOVA Blood Drive

Theta Tau members both work as staff and donate at blood drives hosted at the University of Maryland. This past Spring, we worked with INOVA Blood Donor Services and the university to host an event that was open to the community, enabling more than 50 people to donate blood. This included members of Theta Tau and people from the surrounding campus community.

Through a sponsorship by Giant Foods, members were able to put together care packages with winter essentials like gloves, scarves, and canned food for Shepherd's Table, a homeless services center in Silver Spring.

Mentorship Program

Our alumni panels are an opportunity for members to gain valuable insight from those who have already graduated. We host two panels, focusing on industry and graduate school. As people who have recently entered the workforce, our industry panelists provide current member with advice about the hiring process, adjusting to life outside of college, and what to look for in a career. Our graduate school panelists talk about their decision to pursue advanced degrees, how to write applications, and their day-to-day experiences. Overall, the alumni panels are a fantastic way for members to network and share ideas in a professional setting. Theta Tau also hosts an alumni dinner every semester where members participate in networking and elevator pitch practices, and learn about various aspects of professional life post-grad.

Atlantic Regional Conference

The Theta Tau Atlantic Regional Conference brings together the Atlantic Regional chapters of Theta Tau every semester to learn from and bond with each other and the Theta Tau National Officers. Each semester, about 200 members from 9 chapters across the DMV gather for the conference. Last spring, we were fortunate enough to visit Virginia Tech for the conference, and are excited for this fall's conference at Johns Hopkins University! A number of corporate sponsors were able to attend, give professional development presentations, and network with the entire Atlantic Region.
